Wildcats capture division crown Harper's five-hitter stops Eldorado, 9-2

Bryan Harper tossed a five-hitter, and Josh Chasse had four hits as **Las Vegas** won the Northeast Division crown with a 9-2 victory at Eldorado on Thursday.

Outside of two second-inning errors that led to Eldorado's runs, the Wildcats played a solid game with so much on the line.

"This division is getting harder and harder to win each year," **Las Vegas** coach Sam Thomas said. "Every team continues to get better in this league. For us to win this division says a lot about our club."

Harper kept the Sundevils (19-13, 10-2 Northeast) off balance with a mixture of off-speed pitches. The left-hander went to a three-ball count just five times and got nine ground-ball outs.

"When Bryan keeps the ball down, he's tough to beat," Thomas said. "After the breakdown in the second, we played solid defense behind him. He turned in a big-time effort tonight."

The Wildcats (21-10, 11-1) broke open a 3-2 game with two runs in the fifth and four in the seventh. Chasse's four hits were all singles, and Las Vegas had 16 hits against Eldorado starter Josh Creveling. Alex Church and Junior Gonzalez each drove in two runs for the Wildcats.

Harper allowed four singles and a double while striking out five in getting the complete-game victory.

Gators strike early in win Green Valley gets four in first vs. Las Vegas

Sometimes the best way to ease any postseason jitters is by scoring early.

Green Valley used that formula Thursday night, scoring four runs in the top of the first inning on the way to an 11-5 victory over Las Vegas in the Sunrise Regional tournament at Basic High School.

It's always nice whenever the kids get up there and score a few runs," Green Valley coach Nick Garritano said. "And I've got to commend the offense. We're hitting the ball at the right time of year."

Adam Javate and Kyle Konicek each had two-run singles in the first.

The Gators (21-10-1) scored a run in the second on a solo home run by Nick Melino, who finished 3-for-5 with three runs.

Konicek was 3-for-4 with a double and three RBIs for the Gators, who led 11-1 before Las Vegas scored four times in the seventh.

Green Valley starter Max Javate pitched out of trouble all night before the Wildcats finally chased him with back-to-back doubles in the seventh.

He allowed three runs on six hits in 6 1/3 innings to get the win.

Las Vegas (22-11) looked as if it might rally in the bottom of the first. Trailing 4-0, the Wildcats loaded the bases with no outs on singles by Junior Gonzalez and Christian Lucero and a walk to Josh Chasse.

But Javate allowed just one run on a sacrifice fly, and Konicek made a diving catch in center field to end the inning.
